Once you've scored yourself on all 20 questions, use the total score to determine your readiness category.

85–100: Faithful & Fully Equipped

Description:

You're a bold, Spirit-led witness in your workplace. You understand the Gospel, live it out daily, and actively seek opportunities to share your faith with compassion and confidence. You're growing in maturity, humility, and clarity—and your coworkers likely see the light of Christ in your life.

Next Steps:

- Mentor someone who's newer to faith-sharing.
- Consider starting a workplace Bible study or prayer group.
- Keep sharpening your Gospel presentation with Scripture.
- Stay rooted in prayer so you continue leading with grace, not pride.
- Explore deeper apologetics or leadership training for workplace ministry.

70–84: On Mission – Growing with Purpose

Description:

You have a strong spiritual foundation and a heart for sharing your faith, but there's still room to grow in clarity, courage, or consistency. You may find yourself holding back in certain conversations, unsure how to start or follow through. The good news: you're right on the edge of a breakthrough.

Next Steps:

- Practice your 2–3-minute testimony and ask a trusted friend for feedback.
- Learn a few key Bible verses that explain the Gospel clearly.

- Read or listen to stories of faith-sharing to build boldness.
- Identify one coworker to begin praying for regularly.
- Reflect on moments when you sensed God prompting you—but hesitated—and consider how you'll respond next time.

Description:

You're on the journey of learning what it means to be a witness in the workplace. You may feel unsure, underprepared, or afraid of saying the wrong thing. But your willingness to assess your readiness means you're already taking a powerful step forward. Remember, this is a journey, and growth takes time. This is where bold witness begins—with honest reflection and a teachable heart.

Next Steps:

- Spend time understanding the core message of salvation (e.g., Romans 3:23, 6:23, 5:8, 10:9).
- Develop the habit of praying daily for opportunities and boldness.
- Begin journaling faith conversations or spiritual observations at work.
- Join a small group or online course focused on workplace evangelism.
- Look for one simple way to serve a coworker as a witness through action.

P Below 50: Starting the Journey – Laying Spiritual Groundwork

Description:

You're likely new to sharing your faith or still growing in your walk with Jesus. That's a great place to begin. This stage is about building confidence in who Christ is, what the Gospel means, and how your own story fits into God's larger plan. Don't rush it—God honors your desire to grow.

Next Steps:

- Spend consistent time in God's Word and prayer to deepen your faith.
- Reflect on how you came to faith and what changed in your life.
- Read a short book or devotional on personal evangelism.
- Attend a workshop or Bible study to grow in community.
- Ask a spiritually mature friend or mentor to guide and encourage you.
